Objectives

The Charity's Objectives, as summarised in its trust deed, are the advancement of education and opportunity for learning in a wide range of subjects from a Christian perspective, and the furtherance of the gospel in the United Kingdom or elsewhere, particularly with the regard to the promotion of God-centred living through faith in Jesus Christ.

In pursuit of these objectives in 2019-20, Thinking Faith Network has carried out activities in each of its three strands: LifeMatters, RealityBites and Faith-in-Scholarship.

In planning their activities, the trustees had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, and it is their constant priority to ensure that public benefit is served by the charity. The trustees take care that access to events is, as far as possible, not restricted by physical or financial barriers. Only the Business Conference has charged fees for attendance, and even there we had a low-cost option. More significantly, our work is about communicating life-enriching and justice-enabling truths, patterns and rituals which have widened our vision of life and therefore – amongst other things – supported our connections and thus our health in lockdown.

Achievements and activities

The year from 1st August 2019 to 31st July 2020 was complicated by our having no Director in post and by the effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic. We became (semi-)proficient in handling Zoom conferences to cope with the latter problem, but we felt handicapped by lacking a Director.

Trustees' meetings have been attended by most of the Board, but one has been noticeably absent throughout the year, a matter which is being addressed. Richard Gunton was elected to the Trustee Board on 12th October 2019 and both he and Steve Bishop attend meetings usually by internet connection, even before that became normal for everyone.

Financial support has been generous, but the number of regular givers has not increased. We are also aware of the lack of younger members of the support community upon whom we will rely for future management and administration. This is a matter of concern.

We have continued to employ Mark Roques and to use the services provided by Ben Clymo as required.

Activities have been carried on in all three streams of Thinking Faith Network's life, as follows:

LIFEMATTERS

We held our annual Faith in Business conference on 9th October 2019, in collaboration with Bradford Cathedral. Thirty-two participants registered to explore "Business and the Kingdom: The Big Picture". Matthew Frost and Cal Bailey each presented a paper, and we are grateful to them and to the leaders of the workshops. The format was found more satisfactory that the earlier pattern with a longer list of speakers. We are greatly indebted to the Cathedral, for their support, and to Karen Williams who managed the event.

A series of discussion events under the title, "Iron Sharpens Iron", began in September 2019, to explore issues of reformational faith in a more informal environment. The first two were convened at Dale Villas (Bun Tan – Secularism; David Hanson – Kuyper and the Public Square). Subsequent meetings have been Zoomed (Paulo Ribeiro – Serving God in Engineering, from Brazil; Elaine Storkey – Identity Politics, from Cambridge).

Between May and July, a mentoring course (by Zoom) was run by Mark and David for two school leavers, pre-university. One will read philosophy and the other art history. The course was supported (brilliantly) by some invited guest teachers. We are grateful to Maarten Verkerk (member of the Dutch Senate), Prof. Roy Clouser, Cal Bailey, Gareth Jones, Richard Russell and Martin & Kate Rose.

REALITYBITES

Mark ran another course at Dale Villas on 'Evangelism without the Cringe Factor' from February 2020 and has had further articles on his methods published by (mainly) the Baptist Times. He continued conversations with the Emmanuel Schools Foundation and with Chris Curtis (who introduced him to the London Diocesan Schools Workers).

He has continued to mentor an MA student on the subject of using hospitality in street evangelism with students and they hope to rework the material as a Grove booklet in due course.

From the c.100 people who have taken his 'Evangelism' courses, feedback showed that something 'very basic' was needed (they know little about worldviews). He has therefore begun working intensively with Anne Burghgraef, and with Peter and Patricia Gray, to produce a 20-unit online course using the lens of slavery and trafficking to set up conversation about Jesus and materialism. Patricia was contracted to provide support for this project.

FAITH-IN-SCHOLARSHIP

Richard Gunton continued to coordinate the FiSch Blog and to maintain (and build) links with The Kirby Laing Institute for Christian Ethics, Church Scientific, The Templeton Foundation and Michael Reiss. The Blog has appeared fortnightly through most of this year but new contributors are needed.

With Steve Bishop and others, he has developed a series of webinars under the 'All-of-Life-Redeemed' banner, and David Hanson was asked to join the two of them in exploring ways of enabling Thinking Faith Network (FiSch in particular) to work with them in some form of organisational unity.

Finances and reserves policy

In the 2019-20 period, the charity received income of £18,401 (2018-19: £23,485) and made expenditure of £18,190 (2018-19: £17,096), a surplus of £211 (2018-19: £6,389). The closing balance at the end of the period was £42,747 (2018-19: £42,536).

The trustees aim to hold free reserves of 9-12 months' expenditure. Free reserves at the end of the period were £42,747, above the window of £13,643 to £18,190 (based on this year's expenditure).

The Trustees recognise that they cannot continually hold reserves above the level specified in their reserves policy. They have recently increased the paid hours of the RealityBites Director, and in the coming year anticipate additional expenditure on a freelance project manager and designer to work with Mark to deliver a new online course. With that in mind, they will continue to monitor reserves through the next year to ensure that they are brought down to the required level.
